A distinguished and decorated combat pilot — he was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, 27 Air Medals and the Bronze Star Medal for his service during the Vietnam War with the 101st Airborne Division — Randy Mains served as a simulator instructor and flight examiner and is currently a certified CRM/AMRM instructor, assessor and facilitator. Together, CRM and AMRM can have a powerful impact and help reduce accidents.
